Child protection and youth justice linked data collection: progress report 1

February 2014

Background

The purpose of this project is to develop a linked data set that can be used to report on the relationships between child protection and youth justice. This project builds on previous projects linking child protection, SAAP and youth justice data (AIHW 2008, 2012a, 2012b). Outcomes will include the identification of key questions, a method to link these collections on an annual basis and the development of standard analysis to answer the key questions.

Progress

Establish reference group

A meeting was held with Mark Collis (AJJA Chair) in September 2013 to confirm scope and discuss the reference group. It was agreed that the RIG would be the reference group and that AJJA would determine the members of the project control group.

Following the meeting, the AIHW provided the AJJA secretariat with a list of milestones and dates for progress reports to the project control group.

Review previous linkage project and identify and pilot any additional data items required for successful linkage

This activity is still in progress as it will need to be further discussions at the RIG meeting in April. No delay to the overall project is anticipated.

The method and results of the earlier project linking JJ NMDS data, SAAP NDC data and limited child protection data found that aliases and additional demographic detail were useful in identifying records belonging to the same person. Review of potential data items also found that a date accuracy indicator and information about child protection involvement would also assist the linkage.

A request for information about the availability of additional data items was sent to jurisdictions in October 2013. All jurisdictions had responded by late January 2013.

Date accuracy indicator

Four jurisdictions can provide information on the accuracy of the date of birth. Of these, 2 can provide it at the detailed level of the METeOR date accuracy indicator (i.e. for each component of DOB), while the remaining jurisdictions can provide a simplified version.

Recommend that the piloting of a date accuracy indicator in the JJ NMDS be discussed further at the JJ RIG.

Aliases

All states and territories record aliases, although there may be issues in accessing or extracting the information in the required format. Five jurisdictions indicated that they

would be able to provide letters of name for aliases in a consistent format with the letters of name data element in the JJ NMDS.

Recommend that the piloting of alias letters of name in the JJ NMDS be discussed further at the JJ RIG.

Additional demographic information

Most jurisdictions record additional demographic information to that supplied for the JJ NMDS. The most common is preferred language.

Recommend that the piloting of additional demographic information for the purposes of linkage with child protection data be discussed further at the JJ RIG.

Child protection information

Most jurisdictions record some information indicating that a young person has or has had an involvement in the child protection system, although this information is often limited and inconsistently recorded. Nevertheless, it would assist in the verification of links with the child protection data.

Recommend that the piloting of child protection information for the verification of links with child protection data be discussed further at the JJ RIG.
