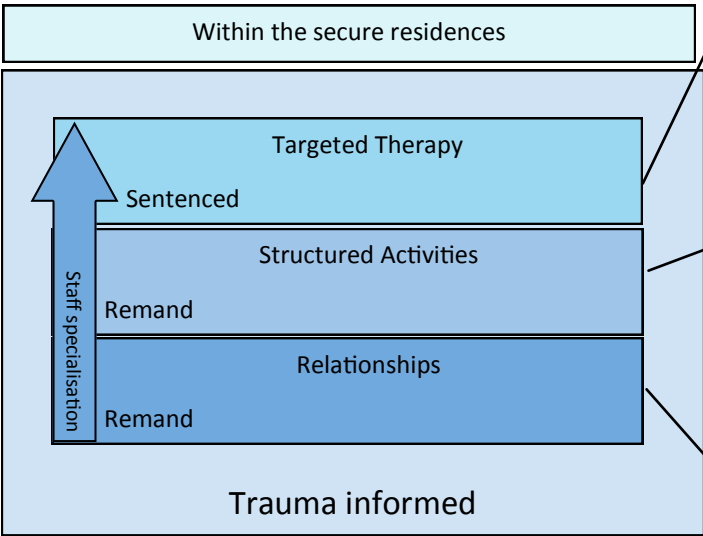
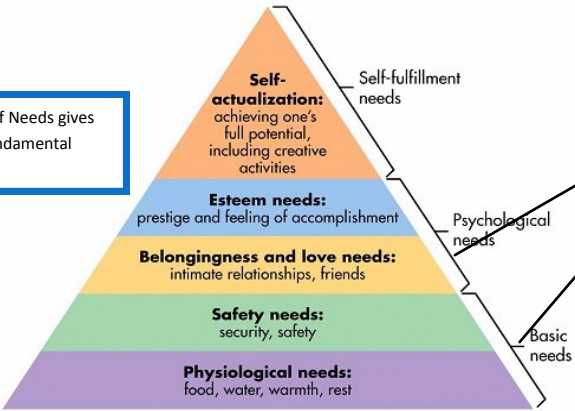


Youth Justice Residences treatment: conceptual structure V1.0



Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs gives some guidance on fundamental approach



Interventions: help with long term change

Skills training

Therapeutic interventions to address offending needs

Mental health needs

Required

Therapy programme components including for defined sub populations

Therapy people

Links to external specialists and agreement on ways of working together .

Structured day: helps with motivation and readiness to change. Generalises skills

Education, Citizenship/ skills training

Vocational

Recreation, Sport, leisure time (music, hobbies)

Transition planning - to independent living if needed

Required

Youth centred rhythm in the units

Links to community organisations and supports

Transition process for longer

Relationships underpin everything. Without good relationships nothing will work

Rostering

Staff training for skills

Clear roles: Case work, youth work, transition support, assessment and planning

Supervision, support, mentoring, knowledge

Induction
